The object then began to move slowly southwards and the whole thing was flashing in and out. I watched it until it disappeared out of sight.

19 MARCH ?

At SOUTH DRIVE I stopped the car which I had been following for several minutes.

The OBJECT or LIGHT FORMATION appeared moving slowly from ANNIEGLAND direction and was constant in height estimated at between 200 - 400 FEET ABOVE GROUND LEVEL.

While stationary, in SOUTH DRIVE, I had an extremely clear view of the FORMATION then it came to a standstill very close to VICTORIA PARK.

It was in the form of a CHRISTMAS TREE at a height of APPROX. 250-300 FEET AGL and remained there for between one and two minutes.

I then observed another smaller object appear from ground level relative to where I was standing.

This object rose from behind some buildings that lay in my view and was of a definite triangular shape small in size. It had low power white lights also triangular within the defined shape of the object.

It then moved vertically from the ground and travelled horizontally a very short distance estimated as 100 yards and proceeded to merge into one of the corners of the LIGHT FORMATION and was then no longer visible when the three lights extinguished.

The LIGHT FORMATION remained stationary throughout this event then disappeared like a light bulb being switched off within 15-30 seconds. No distinctive shape of the secondary object could be observed within the primary formation after the object merged.

On site examination by myself and a fellow investigator has revealed the possible location where the small object arose and might be one of two locations, either the YARROW SHIPYARD or immediately opposite over the RIVER CLYDE BARR & STROUD ELECTRONICS.

No sound was emitted at any stage throughout the sighting and was definitely not an aircraft, helicopter or balloon.

UFO fear for local family



Luke Barnard: "There was something up there. I just don't know what it was."

A LOCAL mother has described her fear as she watched what appeared to be an unidentified flying object in the sky above Brecon.

Mrs Sarah Barnard had just collected her son Luke, 10, from a snorkelling class at Brecon swimming pool. She was driving Luke and daughter Bianca, 12, back to their St John's home via Hay Road last Thursday night. It was very dark but clear.

Their first warning of anything unusual came from Luke in the back of the car just as they had rounded the left turn at the junction near Bishop's Meadow.

Mrs Barnard later estimated the time at about 9:20pm. "Luke said 'what are those lights. Mum?' I said 'I don't know.' Bianca said 'what is it?' - I said 'I don't know'. We were mesmerised for a few seconds.

"There was this circle of red lights across the field. I stopped the car and wound down the window. There wasn't a sound. It was dead quiet and these lights were slowly coming towards us.

"My heart was pounding. It was practically over the car. It took ages to get to us - I must

have been there for five minutes waiting for it to come.

"You could sense it was solid because everything was going dark over us as if a big cloud had come over."

Mrs Barnard said it was difficult to estimate the diameter of the ring of the 10-20 steady red lights, which appeared to stand vertically in the sky like a big clock face. She thought the silent object was only as far away when she first saw it as the end of her street from her home - not more than 200 or 300 metres.

"I was frightened," she said. "I honestly thought if it came over us we would be 'zapped up' - I know it sounds silly. I was trying to look to see what it was, wondering was it an aeroplane?" They all knew the lights were not an aircraft or anything else they had seen in the sky before.

The mysterious object was almost above the Vauxhall car when Mrs Barnard drove off. "If my mum had been stood on the roof she would have been able to touch it," said Luke.

"As I drove off I looked up and I could see this big thing

over me, and I thought 'Oh my god I've got to go.' My heart was pounding. I was sweating and awful thoughts were going through my mind," said Mrs Barnard.

If the object had continued on its course, Mrs Barnard guessed it would have passed north of Brecon Leisure Centre and travelled over the empty road towards Gwastrafford.

Her excited children wanted to tell their grandmother about the inexplicable sighting and their fear gave way to laughter and thoughts of little green men as they drove away.

Mrs Barnard, who works at Dering Lines and whose husband Brian is a builder, had never had any sort of strange experience before and reported the unidentified object to the RAF.

An MoD spokesman said they had not received any other reports of anything unusual in the skies that night.

None of the family know what they saw last week. They have recovered from their mysterious experience but are left wondering.

"I was scared," said Luke. "What was it going to do to us?" He looked up, and added "And where is it now?" See cartoon on page eight

1. At about 22.00-22.15hrs on Sunday, 25 Feb 96, Section 40 accompanied by her Section 40 daughter, was driving south from Aberystwyth on the A487 road. About half way between Blaenplwyf and Llanrhytud they saw a large pale (whiteish) light in the 11 o'clock position at an angle of 30-45° from the horizontal. The light was diffused or "watered down" and most unusual. It moved slowly from left to right across their path.
2. Shortly afterwards several white lights appeared from the area of the first sighting and proceeded to approach the car, passing over it very, very low ("skimmed the car") from right to left. These appeared to "become" an elliptical white light behind hills to the left of them which eventually went out. As the lights crossed the car the observers were looking up at, perhaps, an angle of 80°.
3. Section 40 seemed a very sensible and responsible person who does not believe in UFOs. However, neither she nor her daughter have ever seen anything like this before and, if we have an explanation, they would be interested to know.
4. The weather was cloudy at the time. Section 40 telephone number is Section 40. We have had no other reports of such sightings to date and I find it difficult to imagine the cause of this.
