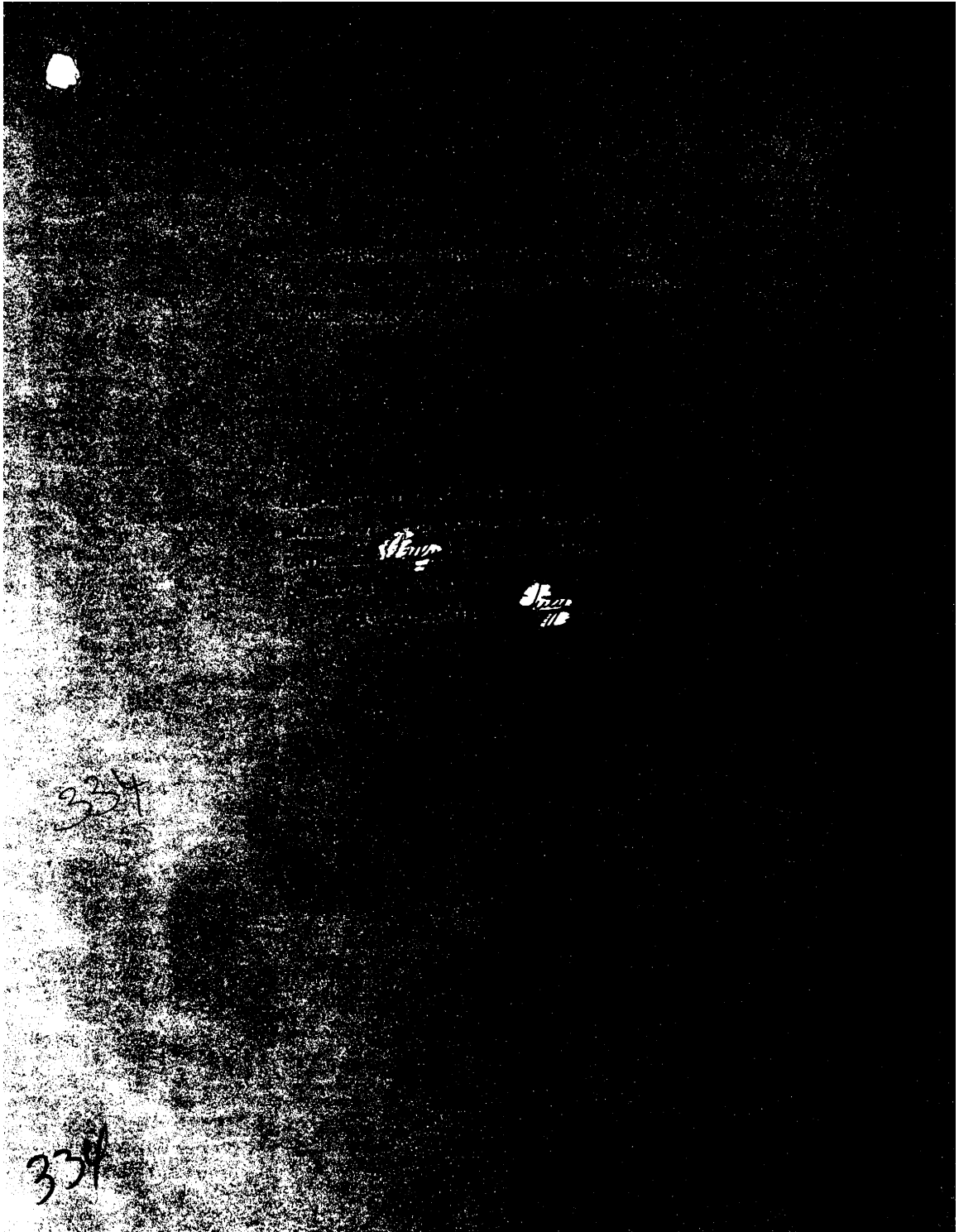

1. On or about 12 Nov 75, a series of visual sightings of unidentified flying objects occurred. Certain CF members at CFS Falconbridge reported both visual and radar sightings at the same time. The Commanding Officer at the time, Major R. Oliver, did not confirm the sightings to the press, nor would he confirm that the objects had been seen on radar. Subsequently, Air Command apparently gave the CO permission to speak to the press and a highly coloured story appeared in the "National Enquirer" related to the Sudbury sightings.
2. Approximately one year later, (2) began writing to CINCNOAD demanding release of information pertinent to the Falconbridge incident. Responses to (2) stated that while the information was in the public domain, as a result of the National Enquirer article, the documentation was not releasable since it came under the Official Secrets Act and therefore was not subject to U.S. Freedom of Information disclosure.
3. Over a period of six months (2) letter<sup>s</sup> to CINCNOAD became increasingly objectionable, and a decision was made to approach NDHQ to obtain release of the documentation. The information was cleared for release and subsequently forwarded to (2)
4. NORAD is well aware that "Blue Book Project Reports" which originate in Canada, are not automatically subject to release to the public sector under the US Freedom of Information Act. If the suit by (2) is successful it is anticipated that the documentation on Falconbridge can be released without problem since it has already been delivered to another U.S. citizen.

5. Recent contacts with the NORAD information office reveals that efforts to obtain UFO information by organizations such as ② group are a continuing problem. The solution, in Canada's case, proposed at Ref A, of involving NRC in any responses would alleviate most of the workload imposed on NDHQ staffs in responding to requests for information directed at the CF.

In a letter dated October 8, 1981, Colonel R. W. Fentiman of the 22nd NORAD Region, advised me that reports of Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) received by the 22nd NORAD Region Senior Director are forwarded to the National Defence Operations Center.

( ② ) and we would like to know if it is at all possible for your Government to furnish us with copies of whatever UFO reports you may be in possession of. Needless to say, we would be more than willing to reimburse your Government for any expenses involved in furnishing such material.

In particular, we are interested in any information that may exist concerning the numerous UFO sightings that occurred at the radar site at Falconbridge during the September-December 1975 time period. As you are probably aware, UFO sightings occurred at various US Air Force bases along the Canadian-US border during this time period, as well as at Canadian Forces radar sites and surrounding areas.

The United States Air Force and Department of Defense have furnished us with copies of numerous documents pertaining to these sightings, but information on the sightings that took place in Canada are very scarce. We believe these sightings are extremely important and wish to enlist your aid in obtaining further information on them. Any assistance you might be able to provide would be greatly appreciated.



This acknowledges receipt of your letters of the 4th of June 1980 and 22nd of June 1980 with their attachments.

Contrary to your interpretation of the Headquarters USAF letter, we believe there is no American intention to begin a new UFO investigation unless "legitimate evidence is discovered to indicate that we have had visitors from outer space". The quotes are from the attachments to your letters. No legitimate evidence has been received by either US or Canada. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration has decided that, "nothing is to be gained by further investigation", a decision agreed to by the USAF.

Obviously, you will understand that unless a demonstrable threat to Canadian or Allied National Security exists from UFOs, the Canadian Forces cannot spend money on determining the nature of such UFOs. As you are aware, our resources are already fully committed. UFOs must first be proven to be a threat by the scientific community, including private researchers like yourself, before any action can be taken by this department. Since the National Research Council is the government department collating evidence of UFOs, we suggest that, should you reach some provable conclusions on their nature, you should communicate directly with them.




