Dear Sir,

At the risk of being categorised in some lunatic fringe group, I would like to inform you of a U.F.O. incident that occurred here last Sunday, 16/11/86.

My family and I had just finished lunch and I was lying in the shade on our small lawn looking skywards.

I saw a whitish object at great height. It appeared to be spiraling and could have been a large plastic bag or balloon envelope. It was drifting slowly in a northerly direction from the south. Wind on the ground was very light and moving in the same direction. No cloud.

With binoculars I could see that it appeared to be twisting one way then the other.

Then a guest, the local teacher pointed out another object slightly further east and either higher or physically smaller.

It gave no impression of moving at all, simply a small lump of white. The binoculars shed no information and I was able to observe the stationary object for a minute or so until it suddenly moved off rapidly in an easterly direction at right angles to the prevailing air movement. (0630 UTC).

The word rapid is a bit of an understatement, from a zero movement to a speed much faster than any military craft I have seen or satellite for that matter.

I followed with the binoculars as it moved from the overhead position until it vanished beyond some low hills that are to the east of us.

I got the impression that it had made a rapid descent.

There was no indication of building up acceleration. Time taken for it to cross from the position above us to disappearing would have been in the order of 3 to 4 seconds. Very fast.

The original balloon sack, or whatever I had first spotted was now not to be seen, however just 15 minutes later at 0645 UTC, I again picked up another object/speck and in about the same directly overhead position. Within a couple of seconds of detecting it, it too shot off, but in a slightly different, northeasterly direction and I followed its rapid departure with the binoculars until I lost it in the white glare near the horizon.

I was then subjected to a string of jokes about aliens etc and was surprisingly the only person present that took the sightings with any degree of interest.

Now none of us were drinking alcohol and to my knowledge there is no swamp gas out here. I am not a member of any U.F.O. or flying saucer club.

[REDACTED] is in a very remote area and we would be lucky if we saw or heard one aircraft per month but we know one when we see it.

These objects made no noise and left no vapour trails. Conditions were ideal for viewing. They were observed with and without binoculars and by myself and the by the community school teacher.

They were either too small or too far away to detect detail.

I have since visited the area where these things looked like they were headed and of course found nothing. This is not surprising considering the size of the place.

I think that both the teacher and I are reasonably clear headed blokes.

What do you think we saw and have you heard of similar reports?

It would not appear to have been an aircraft. It is worth noting that it was also observed by the RAAF pilots of the aircraft in support who refused to report the incident.

On the night of 9 Jun 87 I was tasked with setting up the SZ at LEARMOUTH Airstrip for a night Free Fall descent. I was the AZSO and I had a Medic, [REDACTED], to assist me on the SZ.

At 1855Hr we were situated on the western side of the runway directly opposite the civilian Terminal. At this time we commenced to place the SZ lights for the descent and at 1900Hr the light was observed on its approach from the East.

The C130 aircraft involved with the activity was still on the ground and did not become airborne until 1915Hr. The object had disappeared by this time.

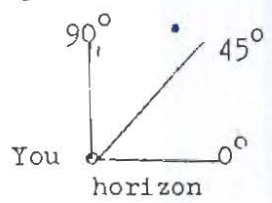
Once the aircraft was airborne I tried to establish communication on VHF. Communications were not established both on primary or alternate frequency. Two VHF radios were used and both had a fresh battery fitted. The C130 was at 10,000' and even when it flew directly over the strip communications was non-existent.

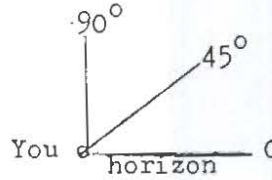
On completion of the activity I spoke to the pilot who was [REDACTED] of 36 Sqn RAAF on what had occurred. He also explained to me that the aircraft had tried to establish communication on VHF primary and alternate frequencies with no success.

This was the first time during the period 3-9 Jun 87 that communication from ground to air with the C130 was not obtainable.

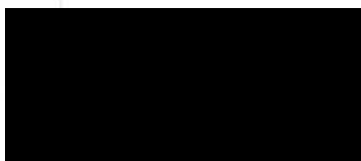

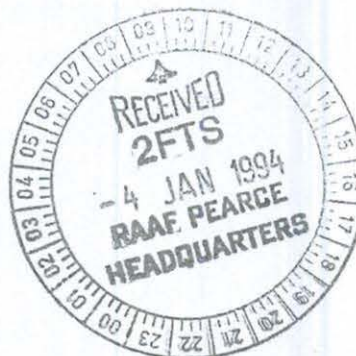
