

Thank you for your report of an Unusual Aerial Sighting (UAS). The investigation of reports of Unusual Aerial Sightings in Australia is carried out by the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF). Preliminary investigation of the reports is conducted at the nearest RAAF base. The reports are then forwarded to the Department of Defence (Air Force Office) where an investigating team completes the investigation. At this stage no one else has reported a similar sighting.

90 per cent of sightings reported to the RAAF were attributed to causes which include aircraft, satellites, meteors, space debris re-entry, meteorological balloons, stars and planets. Seven per cent of reports were either received too late or did not provide sufficient information to permit proper analysis and evaluation. Three per cent of reports were attributed to unknown causes.

The United Kingdom Air Ministry has stated that on an average, 90 per cent of the sightings it investigates are explainable by causes ranging from meteorological balloons and meteors to aircraft lights. The other ten per cent probably remain unexplained because of lack of reliable information.

The University of Colorado, under contract to the United States Air Force (USAF), spent two years processing and investigating all American reports. The findings were published in 1968, by Bantam Books, as the 'Condon Report'. The general conclusion was that 'nothing has come from the study of UFOs in the past 21 years that has added to scientific knowledge' and that 'further extensive study of UFOs probably cannot be justified in the expectation that science will be advanced thereby'. A panel of eminent scientists, chosen by the US National Academy of Sciences, has examined and endorsed the Condon Report.

The USAF 'Project Blue Book' investigation of unidentified aerial objects between 1953 and 1965 analysed 7,641 UFO reports. The conclusions were:

- a. 80 per cent of sightings were natural phenomena, hoaxes, birds or man-made objects;
- b. 17 per cent of sightings provided insufficient data to permit thorough analysis and evaluation; and

c.

three per cent were unidentified.

United States and Soviet space exploration has found no evidence to support the theory of life on planets in our solar system. The Mariner series of space exploration to Mars appears to have proved it a 'dead' planet. The only other source of extra-terrestrial life, therefore, would have to be in another solar system. The nearest visible star to Earth is Alpha Centauri which is about 25 million million miles away. Even if life forms existed there and were capable of space travel at speeds currently known to man, i.e. about 25,000mph, they would take about 115,000 years to reach Earth. Consequently, the probability of extraterrestrial life forms visiting Earth is extremely remote.

Thank you for your report of an Unusual Aerial Sighting (UAS) on 11 March 1987.

From the information you passed to the duty Air Traffic Control officer the characteristics of the sighting fit the description of a meteor, or less likely, a re-entry of space debris.

Meteors can be seen at all hours between dusk to dawn and their duration can range anywhere from one second, to as long as twenty seconds. On the other hand, re-entries of orbiting material have been seen for as long as two minutes. Meteors have been described in a large variety of shapes with or without a trail and can appear in a variety of colours, even green. The trajectory of any meteor can also appear to adopt any direction and angle including upward. If your sighting had those characteristics but was of a considerable duration then it could have been a re-entry of orbiting material.

If the above explanation does not fit your sighting please feel free to fill in and return the enclosed form to me at the above address. If the report is of military significance the RAAF will investigate it further. You may also wish to pursue the matter with many of the UFO Research branches around Australia.



On the night of 9 Jun 87 I was tasked with setting up the AZ at LEARMONTH Airstorys for a night Free Full descent. I was the AZSO and I had a Medic, to assist me on

AT 18551k we were cituated on the western side of the runway directly opposite the civilian Terminal. At this time we commenced

to place the DZ lights for the descent and at 1900 Hz to light was observed on its approuch from the East.

the C130 aircraft involved with the activity was still on the ground and did not become airobourne until 1915 Hz. The object had disappeared by this time.

Once the aircraft was airbourne I tried to establish communications on VHF. Communications were not established both on primary or alternate frequency. Two VHF radios were used and both had a fresh battery fitted. The C130 was at 10,000' and even when it flew directly over the strip communications was non existent.

On completion of the activity I spoke to the pilot who was explained to me that the aircraft had tried to establish communication on VHF primary and alternate frequences with no success.

This was the first time during the period 3-9 Jun 87 that communications from ground to air with the C130 was not obtainable.
