Staff at the ACR attempted to contact Leeds & Bradford airport without gain.

I spoke to the caller and obtained details as per FSO 22 Part f para.71.

The object was as bright as the brightest star, however there were no stars in the sky at that time, the moon being visible and in the same aspect. No sounds were apparent and no smell.
- c) [redacted] were first aware of the object when out walking on Riverdale Road, Otley. The object could also be seen from Hamilton Terrace. Mrs [redacted] contacted friends who live on Weston Park View, Otley, which is north of the river. They are also witnesses to the sighting.

- e) On foot, walking at first then stationary to observe the object.
- f) Naked eye initially, then by binoculars. Photograph taken.
- g) In the sky to the North West of Otley. Above Baildon Moor.

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request regarding UFO sightings in Northumberland since 2001. Your request has been passed to this Department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence regarding UFOs. I apologise for the delay in replying.

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

With regard to the records the MOD holds of reported UFO sightings, I should inform you that they are not held electronically but are filed on paper files in the order in which they are received and we currently hold records spanning a 25 year period. They are not segregated by geographical area. In order to identify records specifically from Northumberland, a manual search of thousands of records would be required and this would exceed the £600 cost limit set for compliance with the FOI Act 2000. However, we are currently in the process of compiling a database of UFO sighting reports and this has now been completed for the years 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and to date in 2006. I examined these records, but found no UFO sighting reports for Northumberland for those years.

In the meantime, you may wish to be aware that there is some information about UFO's available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after 5 years until 1967 when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1977 are now available for public viewing. The National Archives can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone, 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. This can be found on the internet at: <http://www.nationalarchives.gov.uk>. The Ministry of Defence Freedom of Information website also contains some released information on UFOs. This can be accessed via the internet at: <http://www.mod.uk/DefenceInternet/FreedomOfInformation/PublicationScheme>.

I hope this is helpful. If you are unhappy with the response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of this request, then you should contact the undersigned in the first instance. Should you remain dissatisfied, then you may apply for an internal review by contacting the Director of Information Exploitation, 6th Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e.mail: InfoXD@mod.uk).

If you are still unhappy following an internal review, you may be able to take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed. 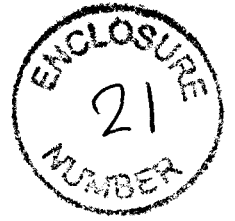

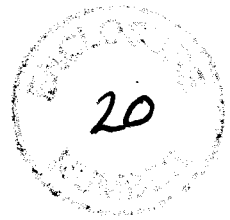

I am writing with reference to your enquiry to the MOD Press Office on the 27 June about a UFO sighting on the 8 June 2006. Your request has been considered to be a request made in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act and passed to this Department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence regarding UFOs. I apologise for the delay in sending this response.

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

You asked if Upper Heyford has been used for military activity since it has been closed. The base was handed back to the MOD in 1994, and has not been a working base since then, so no military activity would have come from there on the date of the sighting.

I have enquired as to if there was any military activity on the date of the UFO sighting, and have been informed that there was no low flying, but there could have been military activity over the area, but without checking every RAF base, I can not give you any details.

You commented on the regularity of UFO sightings in the Banbury, area. Generally, we very rarely receive any sightings from this area, and this sighting report that you have forwarded to us, has been the only one within the last five years. With regard to how many sighting reports we have received in the UK, generally sighting reports have dwindled over the last few years. In the past five years we have received only 703 sightings in the United Kingdom.

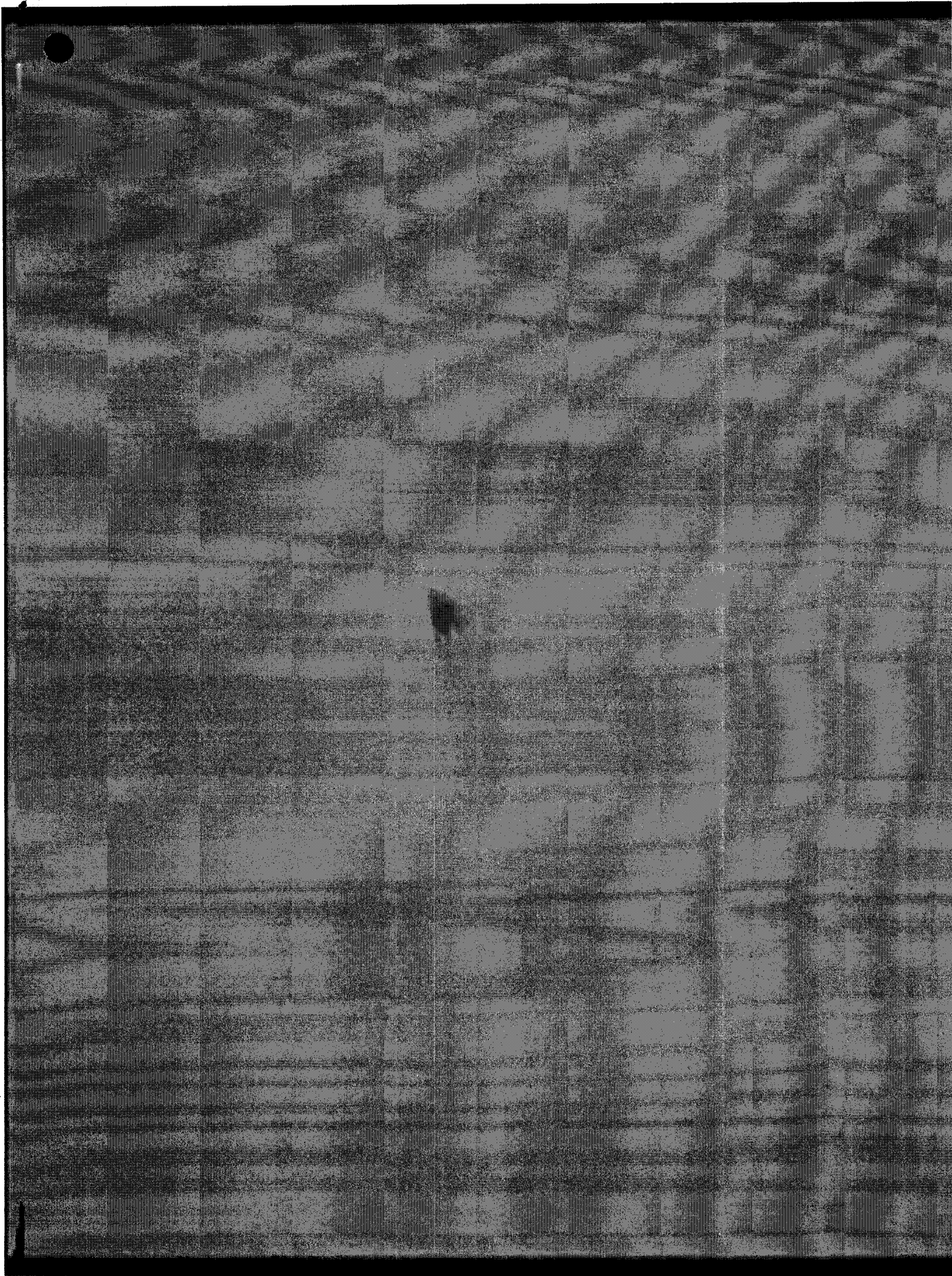

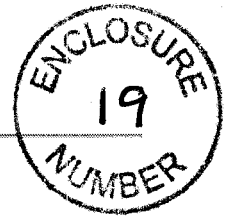

I can inform you that the MOD UFO report files for the period up to 1984 are no longer held by the MOD so I am unable to assist with the first two parts of your request. As you stated in your letter of 22 January 2007, these records have been passed to The National Archives, Kew, Richmond, Surrey and should be available for viewing shortly. Details of how to access information at The National Archives can be found on their website at www.nationalarchives.gov.uk.

I attach a copy of a UFO sighting report by 2 Sheffield police Officers for 2 February 1988. Although the names and addresses of individuals have been removed under exemption s.40 (Personal Information) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I believe that this report (the first one in the batch) is the one you are looking for.

I have been unable to find a copy of any UFO report from West Midland police officers for the period around 18 February 1988. However, as part of a more general search for reports during February 1988, I have found a number of reports from around that date that may be of interest to you.

You will, notice that information at the top and bottom of some pages has been blacked out. This is the security classification which is now no longer required. Additionally, as previously, mentioned, names and addresses of individuals have been removed under exemption s.40 (Personal Information)

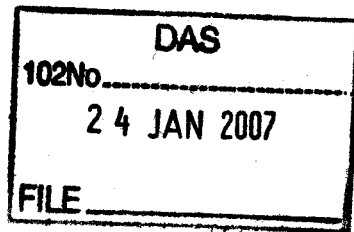

I understand that I can make a Freedom of Information Act by writing to your address. I am interested in UFO sightings made by police officers and am doing research into UFO sightings from the Yorkshire area that were reported to RAF Finningley during the 1980s. I've found out that details would have been entered on a form which was sent to a branch of the MOD called "DS8".

I would like to make an FOIA request for copies of these and of any follow up investigations made into them such as reports, letters or papers you have on file about four separate sightings or groups of sightings that I'm looking into. I've tried to find as much information as possible to help you find them:

No 1: An unusual sighting reported to RAF Finningley by Section 40 of Section 40 near Sheffield, on 21 January 1981. Section 40 said she saw a strange object in a field on the farm through her kitchen window. This sighting was mentioned by Squadron Leader Section 40 the public relations officer at RAF Finningley, in a discussion about UFOs on Radio Sheffield about a year later.

No 2: A sighting reported by officers from the Metropolitan police at Stanmore, Middlesex, to the RAF and Civil Aviation Authority on 26 April 1984. The police witnesses in this case were Section 40 and Section 40. I'm told they also made sketches of the UFO which should be in your files.

No 3: A sighting made by two Sheffield police officers, Section 40 and Section 40, near Ecclesfield Police Station on the night of 2 February 1988. Again I'm told they reported this sighting to RAF Finningley who passed on details to DS8. Their sighting happened during a time (January-February 1988) when many

other UFO reports were reported from Sheffield and Doncaster. I am sure some of these must have been sent by the police and Finningley to "DS8" in London, so I would be grateful if you could send me anything the MOD have on file about the sighting that happened in this month in South Yorkshire, such as information from the RAF about possible explanations like low flying aeroplanes.

No 4: UFO sightings made by police officers in the West Midlands, reported in the Daily Mirror and Sun on 18 February 1988 (I guess the sightings must have happened a day or two before this date). Again the report says their reports were sent to the MOD. In this case the crews of two different patrol cars from Willenhall and Walsall were involved, and their names are given as **Section 40** and **Section 40**

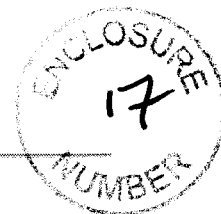

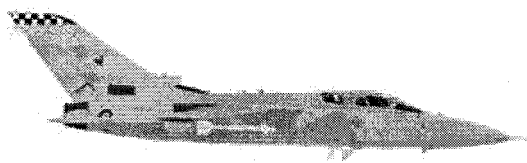

- 1 I spoke to you last week to explain that I have recently taken over the work previously undertaken by S9(Air) on US Visiting Forces in the UK. This has been combined with the existing work in Secretariat (Air Staff) in dealing with operational matters affecting the USAF in the UK. I should be very happy to meet you if you would care to drop in when you are in Main Building.
2. I also said that, over quite a lengthy period now, we have been receiving correspondence from the public and also Parliamentary Questions and Enquiries about the perceived United States experimental aircraft project which has been called "Aurora" in correspondence and questions we have received and in the Press. I know that this phenomenon has also been given a good deal of public and Press attention in the United States and I seen a number of Press articles. I am also aware that your Air Force Secretary made a public statement about it. However as you will appreciate despite all denials, this subject seems set to provoke further public and media interest.
3. Earlier Parliamentary Questions here in London were most appropriately dealt with by an Answer (which was agreed with your staff) on the lines "This is a matter for the United States Government". However I mentioned that the most recent Question asked whether the British Government had authorised flights over the United Kingdom and landings by an experimental aircraft of the United States Air Force or any other United States Government body. We made formal enquiries of the responsible agencies in the UK and of your Air Attache and answered the Question in the negative. I attach an extract from Hansard which gives the Question and Answer. However continuing Questions of this nature cause us some concern and my Secretary of State has been advised that I would be contacting the United States authorities in order to restate the MOD position and to seek





confirmation that if any such unusual aircraft activity were to be envisaged by the United States Government which would in any way affect the United Kingdom, the United States Government would approach the Ministry of Defence to seek prior agreement. In this context when similar Parliamentary Questions were tabled in 1988 concerning speculation about the "Stealth" aircraft - the F117A - the Minister for the Armed Forces said that the aircraft had not flown in the UK and that should the US authorities wish to deploy it to this country a request for approval would have to be submitted to MOD Ministers.

4. As I mentioned in our telephone conversation, I am writing to draw this to your attention and would be most grateful if you would pass this advice to any United States Government Department or Agency which you feel should be aware of it. I should also be grateful for your confirmation as set out above.

AURORA

You may have seen an article in the 12 December 1992 edition of Janes Defence Weekly which speculates on a hypersonic replacement for SR71, and what has been called Project AURORA. The Janes article was picked up by the National press, and on the weekend of 12/13 December, the Washington Post carried two articles on AURORA. Secretary of the Air Force, The Honorable Donald B Rice, was to say the least incensed by the renewed speculation, and the implied suggestion that he had lied to Congress by stating that AURORA did not exist. He appeared on CNN television to categorically deny that there is no secret, or secretly funded, black programme to replace the SR71.

Janes quoted sightings by an engineer on the oil rig Galverston Key in the North sea in August 1989. The oil rig engineer claimed that from below, the aircraft was roughly triangular. I have been contacted by HQ USAF and asked what RAF aircraft it might have been. I said that I thought it could have been Concorde, possibly a Tornado with wings swept, or possibly the single remaining Vulcan display aeroplane. The oil rig engineer claims that the aircraft was refueling from a KC-135, and there were F-111 aircraft in the formation. I have pointed out to the Pentagon that it would certainly not have been one of our aeroplanes because we use probe and drogue refueling, but they wish to cover all the options, and seem to think that as we have only one Vulcan which does not fly often, it could have been the Vulcan. Secretary Rice has asked if we could say whether the Vulcan was flying in August 1989 in the area of the Galverston Key oil rig. I have said this is difficult without precise dates, but I would contact you to see if perhaps the display

pilot could be asked, in the most general terms, whether he might have been flying in the Galverston Key oil rig area in August 1989.

When I receive your reply, I will reiterate to HQ USAF that the most they can say is the RAF has triangular aircraft, and there is a possibility that an RAF aircraft was seen.

The Janes Defence and newspaper articles appeared after Lt Gen [REDACTED] had asked me about the supposed sighting of a stealthy vehicle off Macrihanish; this sighting is not mentioned in the media articles. However, if the photograph of the vehicle near Macrihanish is a spoof, it could be part of the AURORA saga. As you will have gathered, the whole affair is causing considerable irritation within HQ USAF, and any helpful comments we can make to defuse the situation would be appreciated.

SIGHTINGS OF UNIDENTIFIED OBJECT 

1. I do not normally concern you with the UFO aspect of Sec(AS)'s work but in the light of previous conversations we have had, you may wish to be aware of a recent particularly unusual incidence of UFO sightings over the UK, involving descriptions that match some of the reported characteristics of the so-called "Aurora".

2. The sightings took place over a period of about 3 hours early on Wednesday 31 March. Most of them were in Devon and Cornwall, South Wales and Shropshire. There is a number of factors which make these sightings unusual; firstly, there is a good deal of commonality in the description of the object, and considerable commonality in the times of many of the sightings - around 1.10 am (although several occurred in locations some distance apart at about the same time indicating the possibility of more than one phenomenon); secondly, none of the usual explanations put forward to explain UFO sightings seem applicable; and thirdly, the reliability of the witnesses, a good many of whom were police officers and military personnel. Our latest information indicates that at least seventy people witnessed something, and I have attached a small selection of the reports.

3. My staff have made extensive efforts to find an explanation for these sightings, including discussions with air defence and both civil and military ATC authorities; generally it has been confirmed that nothing unusual was seen, and no requests for clearance for any "unusual activity" have been acknowledged to have been received. However the ATC radar at Burrington recorded some slow moving contacts over North Devon at the same time as some of the sightings in that area were reported. Despite this coincidence West Drayton suggest these recordings could be attributed to clutter. The only other main ATC radar (Clee Hall) which might have picked up contacts in the area in which sightings were reported was in fact not working on primary radar during the period of the sightings and therefore only aircraft working Secondary Surveillance Radar could be seen. Routine checks have advised us that there were no military aircraft operating at the time.

4. Some of the reports state that the object was moving at a very high speed, while some say that it was hovering or moving very slowly. Many of the reports refer to the object being very large, flying low and making a low humming sound. My staff have spoken to a number of the military and police witnesses, many of whom commented that the object was unlike anything they had ever seen before; a

Met Officer at RAF Shawbury reported seeing the object projecting a narrow beam of light at the ground at a height of 400-500 feet and estimated its size at somewhere between a C130 and B747 when it passed over his head at an estimated 4000 feet.

5. In summary, there would seem to be some evidence on this occasion that an unidentified object (or objects) of unknown origin was operating over the UK. Given recent speculation about Aurora by both media and MPs it is surprising that so far this has not been taken up by the Press or, indeed, again by MPs. Frankly, I can see little that we can do to follow it up. If there has been some activity of US origins which is known to a limited circle in MOD and is not being acknowledged it is difficult to investigate further. I would however be interested in your views in the light of your earlier interest about Aurora. I attach a copy of a letter I sent to the US Embassy not long ago which I am assured has been disseminated to all "interested Agencies" in the US.

BACKGROUND NOTE: PQ6859F

1. This Question is the latest in a series from Mr Redmond (and others) over the last four months which arise from speculation about the existence of an ultra-secret hypersonic American reconnaissance aircraft codenamed "Aurora". (Relevant Hansard extracts and a copy of recent press articles are at Annex A.)
2. There is no knowledge in MOD of a "black" American programme of this nature, although it would not surprise the relevant desk officers in the Air Staff and DIS if it did exist. Furthermore, there have been no reports of RAF radar contacts which might match an aircraft with the characteristics of the so-called "Aurora". However, to answer the current Question by saying there have been no radar contacts with "Aurora" pre-supposes the existence of such an aircraft. Instead the draft Answer refers back to that given to one of Mr Redmond's previous Questions (Annex A/1), which was drafted to avoid any implication that such an "Aurora" aircraft existed. The US Embassy is content with the draft Answer.

Hot on the trail of America's biggest flying secret

REPORTS of mysterious, fast-moving radar blips and strange engine sounds have heightened speculation that America's most secret aircraft has been operating in Scottish airspace.

According to reports reaching *The Scotsman*, an RAF air traffic controller was startled to see a radar blip emerge from the area of the joint NATO-RAF station at Machrihanish at approximately three times the speed of sound.

Puzzled, he phoned the remote base near the tip of the Kintyre peninsula to inquire what type of aircraft was being operated — and was promptly told to forget what he had just seen.

At around the same time in November last year, there was a report from nine miles away from the base of an unusual, car-splitting jet noise. While the clues are sketchy,

they fit with what little is already known of a shadowy project called Aurora.

Aurora is believed to refer to the ultra-secret replacement for the high-altitude, Mach 3 SR-71 Blackbird reconnaissance aircraft. Reports of a "stealthy" Blackbird successor have been circulating since the mid-1980s.

It is another product of Lockheed's notorious "Skunk Works" in Burbank, California. This secrecy-shrouded plant has designed the U-2, SR-71 and the F-117A Stealth fighter.

In 1990, just after the SR-71's retirement, the Lockheed Advanced Development Company president, Ben Rich, told *Jane's Defence Weekly*: "There is a need for some vehicle — I didn't say SR-71 — to complement the satellites. I won't tell you what it is, but there is a need."

Told of the Scottish reports, Bill Sweetman, technical edi-

tor of Jane's Information Group and an authority on Stealth aircraft technology, said: "That's very interesting. The last time I received a call out of the blue from a Scottish journalist was about five years ago. He was talking about

reports of F-117s ... operating from Machrihanish."

Speaking from Minnesota, Mr Sweetman said there had been reports since the mid-1980s of high-speed aircraft seen over the Pacific.

Seismologists from the California Institute of Technology had also discovered in recent years that their earthquake sensors were being triggered by some "boom fronts" caused by unidentified aircraft.

"They've been able to build up the track of the boom ... and tracking Mach 3 values back to Nevada," Mr Sweetman said.

"That all adds to the suspicion that there's a very high supersonic, possibly hypersonic, aircraft called Aurora that we don't know about."

For several years, Stealth-watchers' attention has been focused deep on the Nevada desert and the Tonopah Test

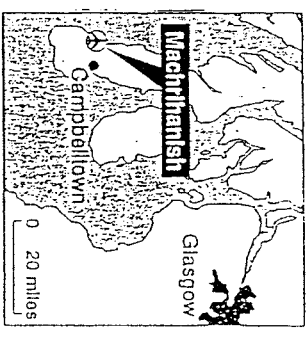
Range airfield, 170 miles north-west of Las Vegas.

It was the initial base for the F-117 Stealth fighter, which the US Air Force managed to keep hidden from prying eyes for seven years until 1988, through a combination of the airfield's remoteness and the simple tactic of flying it only at night.

Mr Sweetman added that the Machrihanish reports of a fast-moving radar contact and of an extremely noisy aircraft fitted in with information from the US.

"It's been described as a noise that people don't forget when they hear it," he said. Several had described it as being "like the sky ripping open".

The MoD was last night still checking to see whether it had any record of a visit by a Blackbird successor. The Pentagon was closed for a US holiday.



Mystery contact may be Aurora

Mounting evidence suggests that the US Government has secretly developed and deployed a hypersonic reconnaissance aircraft, probably as a replacement for the SR-71.

A Royal Air Force air traffic controller tracked a target leaving the NATO-RAF base at Machrihanish, Scotland, at an estimated speed of Mach 3 last November, according to *The Scotsman* newspaper last week. Another witness heard an extremely loud jet noise near the base around the same time, it said.

In the USA, highly supersonic aircraft believed to be operating from Nevada have been detected and tracked by seismological sensors installed by the US Geological Service (USGS). The booms were first recorded in June last year.

Machrihanish is one of the most remote bases in Europe, located near the tip of the Kintyre peninsula in Western Scotland. Recent base modernization and a rumoured association with the F-117

Meanwhile, the California booms are the first substantial, corroborated evidence of unidentified supersonic aircraft operating over the USA.

On at least four occasions, sonic booms have registered on some of the 220 sensors across Southern California, from the Los Angeles basin to the eastern edge of the Mojave desert, according to Jim Mori, a USGS seismologist at the California Institute of Technology. The incidents were recorded in June, October, November and late January. The seismologists estimate that the targets were flying at speeds between Mach 3 and Mach 4.

So far, all the tracks have been headed north and east over the Los Angeles basin, pointing directly to southern Nevada, 500 km away. Most secret US

Air Force activities, including the large flight-test base at Groom Lake, are within the Nellis range in Nevada. Since the range is only 8 min from Los Angeles at such speeds, the targets were presumably decelerating as they crossed the coast.

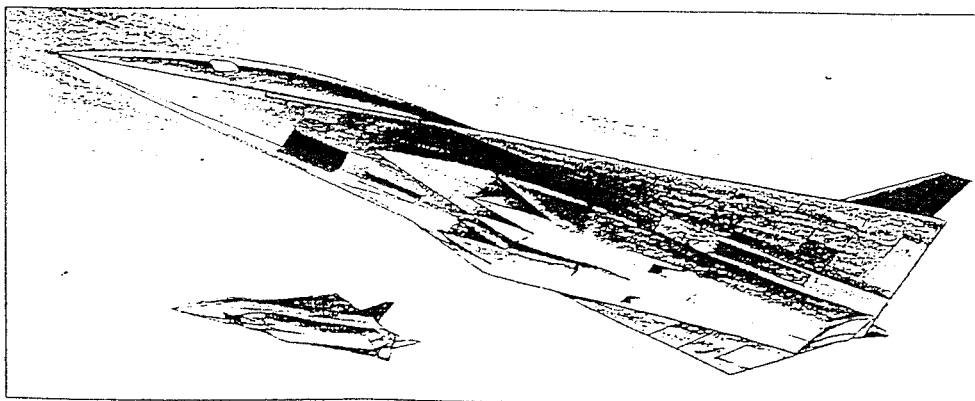
The USGS first noticed that its seismographs could detect sonic booms when they registered space shuttle landings at Edwards AFB, California.

Mori says the wave-forms detected in the latest incidents are characteristic of a smaller vehicle than the 37 m long shuttle orbiter. Neither the shuttle nor the single SR-71B which NASA maintains in flight status were operating on the days the booms were detected.

Reports that USAF is developing hypersonic aircraft in undisclosed 'black' programmes date back to the mid-1980s. In early 1988, the *New York Times* reported that a Mach 6, stealthy reconnaissance aircraft called Aurora was being developed to replace the SR-71, which was retired in early 1990.

More recently, witnesses in Nevada and California have reported hearing extremely loud or 'pulsing' noises caused by unidentified aircraft.

Evidence grows of Mach 3-4 aircraft

Southern California was rattled by the latest in a series of unexplained sonic booms on 16 April. The shock was felt most around the San Gabriel mountains, to the north of the San Fernando Valley.

This is the latest in a series of booms occurring since June last year. They have been linked to highly supersonic aircraft developed under classified, or 'black', programmes (see *Briefing*, p763).

In earlier incidents, a seismograph net operated by US Geological Survey (USGS) researchers at the California

USAF

Institute of Technology indicated that the unidentified aircraft were travelling at speeds of Mach 3-4 in the direction of USAF's secret Groom Lake flight-test facility in Nevada (*JDW* 29 February).

The 16 April boom could not be tracked as accurately as some of the earlier events, said USGS researcher Jim Mori, but had the same characteristics. Most booms have been reported on Thursdays between 0630 and 0700 local time.

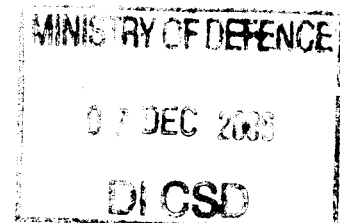
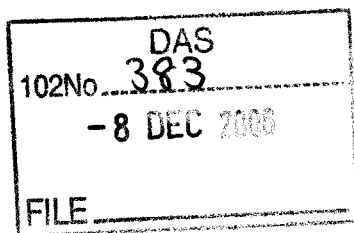

BACKGROUND NOTE: PQ6048

1. This Question is one of four prompted by a recent article in the Scotsman speculating that a secret American aircraft has been operating around RAF Machrihanish. A copy of the background note supporting the draft answers to PQs 5983 and 5979 is attached.

2. In the draft answer to PQ5979 we provided a list of all aircraft types that have operated from RAF Machrihanish since February 1991. None of these aircraft was capable of hypersonic flight, which would take place at speeds in excess of Mach 5 - ie 5 (not 3) times the speed of sound. The draft answer to the present Question therefore reveals no information which could not already be deduced from the previous answer. Ministers may also wish to be aware that the RAF are aware of no operational aircraft capable of hypersonic flight; a fortiori they are certain that no such aircraft has ever operated from RAF Machrihanish.

BACKGROUND NOTE - PQs 5983F and 5979F

1. These two questions from Martin Redmond MP and a third (due for answer later this week) from George Foulkes MP have probably been prompted by a recent article in the Scotsman speculating that "America's most secret aircraft has been operating in Scottish airspace" near RAF Machrihanish. The aircraft is alleged to be a "very high supersonic, possibly hypersonic" aircraft code-named "Aurora", and to be the "ultra-secret replacement" for the SR-71 Blackbird reconnaissance aircraft. Copies of the Scotsman article and a follow-up article in Jane's Defence Weekly are attached at Annex A. A copy of a minute sent to APS/Secretary of State in reply to a request for advice on the former article is attached at Annex B.

2. The last SR-71 left the UK from RAF Mildenhall in January 1990 - this is public knowledge - and HQ 3rd Air Force advise that there have been no further visits to the UK. HQ3AF and the US Embassy have also confirmed that no secret new US aircraft has operated in Scottish airspace. The draft answer to PQ 5979F demonstrates that no unusual aircraft (apart from an Antonov) landed at RAF Machrihanish in the past year.

3. There may or may not be an Aurora project. There is no knowledge in MOD of a "black" programme of this nature, although it would not surprise the relevant desk officers in the Air Staff and DIS if it did exist. The simple answer to PQ 5983F (about what assistance the MOD has given to the US project) would therefore be "none" - but this pre-supposes the existence of the project. Nor would we be likely to be prepared to say publicly if any MOD assistance had been given to such a project. To answer instead that we have no knowledge of any such project is also arguably inappropriate, since in circumstances where we were aware we would probably not be prepared to say so. 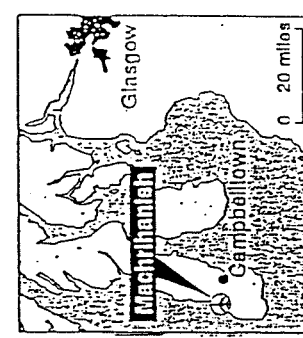

Aerospatiale was due to unveil its MM 15 anti-ship missile at the Asian Aerospace exhibition in Singapore which opened on 25 February.

The ship-launched missile has been developed in the last three months, according to officials from Aerospatiale's tactical missiles division (Engins Tactiques).

The MM 15, derived from the AS 15 TT air-launched weapon system, is designed to meet the growing demand for conventional lightweight weapons to destroy small surface targets within the 8-15 km range.

"Our new MM 15 missile will be offered as a direct competitor to the British Aerospace Dynamics ship-launched Sea Skua," a company official said.

According to Aerospatiale, the MM 15 could fill the gap between the shorter range (8 km) light naval artillery and long range tactical anti-ship missiles such as Exocet (20 km).

"In the 8-15 km gap, there is no effective conventional method of dealing with small targets which do not justify the use of Exocet."

MM 15 has a maximum effective range of 15 km, a maximum speed of Mach 0.9 and weighs 103 kg with a 30 kg warhead, says Aerospatiale. The light weight allows operation by small, fast surface vessels.

The MM 15 has no homing head but is guided by a radar-beam command-guidance technique via the Thomson-CSF AGRION 15 (X-band, pulse-compression) guidance radar installed on the platform.

The radar is used with the AS 15 TT helicopterborne missile system in service with the French, Saudi Arabian and Bahraini navies. It tracks both target and missile and computes the error in range and bearing between them.

Mystery contact may be Aurora

Mounting evidence suggests that the US Government has secretly developed and deployed a hypersonic reconnaissance aircraft, probably as a replacement for the SR-71.

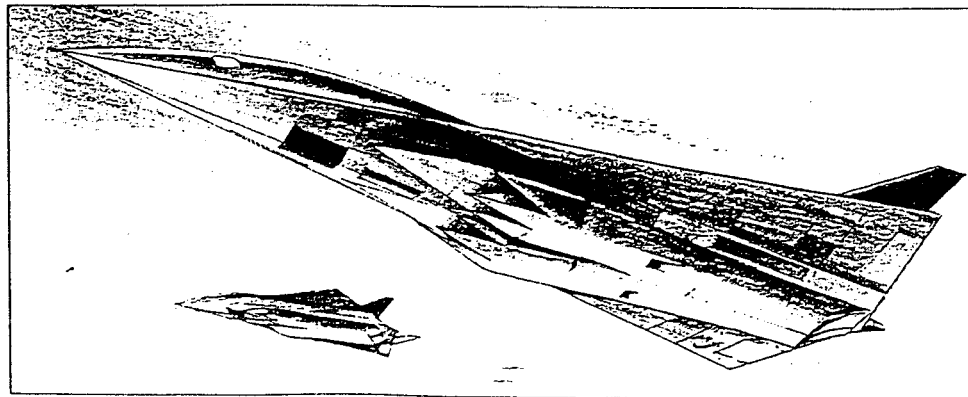

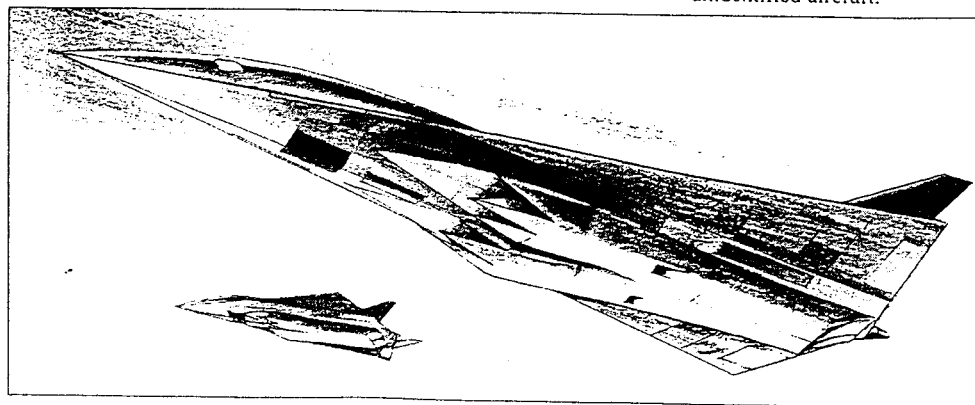

WATER CHARGES: ASSISTANCE WITH PAYMENT

Lord Molloy asked Her Majesty's Government:

Thank you for your letter dated 20 September 2006 in response to my refined FOI request of 29 August submitted to Section 40 regarding the MoD file 'DI55/108/15 Part 4 – UFO Policy.' I will reply to your response referring to your numbered paragraphs:

your paragraph 2. Firstly as you are aware on making my initial request (dated 27 July 2006) I was asked to refine my request from the entire file to three subject areas, a request which I took at face value in my re-submission on 29 August. I am now told 'the volume of information is still quite substantial' and cannot be met within the cost limits. I would point out that in a letter dated 23 August 2005 Section 40 informed me that "this file contains over two hundred pages" (i.e. around 100 enclosures). Please could you explain how the release of a small percentage of this file (i.e. less than 50 pages given your own estimates) could possibly exceed the £600 limit for processing. I would point out that in April this year MoD/DIS approved the release of 650 pages from the UAP Report within the same limit under one FOI request. I cannot accept how you can justify refusing this smaller, specifically redefined request given this precedent.

Your paragraph 3. I am equally unhappy with your decision to aggregate the estimated cost of compliance of this request with another received on 26 August on the grounds that "it appears that the requestors are acting in concert". Given the fact that the existence of this file is public knowledge and has been discussed on numerous email and internet newsgroups, and its contents have been the subject of a number of major newspaper articles (for example, *The Guardian*, 'Is there anybody out there?' 25 September 2006) it is hardly surprising that other independent, interested parties wish to obtain information

from it using the FOIA, which is quite within their legal rights. This merely underlines the public interest in the release of this file and I am surprised to find MoD, given its commitment to the spirit of the FOIA, are reacting to this interest by finding excuses not to fully comply with genuine requests for information.

Your paragraph 4. In response to your offer to refine my request for a second time and specify one subject area that I am interested in, I will base my request upon the contents of my email to **Section 40** dated 29 August, thusly:

I wish to request copies of papers from MoD file DI55/108/15 Part 4 – UFO Policy’ under the general area of **“MoD correspondence concerning public access to UFO files”**.

Specifically, I wish you to include within this category any papers relating to the period (circa 1985-90) when a copy of the standard MoD UFO sighting report proforma was released to a member of the public complete with the internal distribution list containing DSTI/DI55 addresses.

It is my understanding that the distribution list was released in 1985-6 as a result of a clerical error and the involvement of DI55 in providing advice to Sec(AS) on UFO reports entered the public domain for the first time. I understand there was some correspondence relating to this matter between **Section 40** of Sec(AS)2a and a member of the public, **Section 40**, circa October/December 1986. I would expect this correspondence will be filed in the DI55 file I have requested. Therefore I wish my FOI request to encompass this and any subsequent correspondence related to public access to UFO files.

Finally, I wish to protest at the decision that “following a period of sixty working days from the receipt of your next refined request [I] will be able to submit another request”. I would point out to you that my first request was made on 27 July and I was asked to redefine my request – through no fault of my own – on 29 August. On following this advice *I was given by the MoD* (see my paragraph 1) I am told I have redefine my request for a second time and the 60 day period begins from the receipt of this third request. Surely my request should begin from 27 July, not from today’s date. I interpret this as an unjustified attempt to delay the processing of my request still further and as a result I am requesting an internal review of the way this matter has been dealt with.

I look forward to receiving the results of my FOI request in due course.

I have received a FOI request from a regular correspondent asking for copies of documents on the subject of the Aurora, the alleged hypersonic US experimental aircraft. As background, I should tell you that in March 1993 there were a number of UFO sightings that could not be readily explained with the result that ACAS became involved and it was decided to ask the US if they were operating anything hush-hush over our airspace. The sightings were recently the subject of a TV documentary on Channel 5 featuring a now, ex-civil servant, who used to work on the UFO desk in the then Sec(AS).

The general request is for correspondence for the period 1992-93 (inclusive) between the MoD and the US authorities on the subject of the Aurora and whether it was flying over the UK. Whilst we need to be helpful, I believe that the exam question is really getting at whether the US were flying Aurora over our airspace and therefore do not see a need to include any general correspondence on the subject of the Aurora as a whole.

As well as the general question, the applicant is requesting a copy of BDS/RAF/3003 dated 14 Dec 1992 which was apparently forwarded from BDS to London (possibly to ACAS) and passed on USAF concern about a possible stealthy aircraft flying from UK airspace. I believe the US Lt Gen Section may have got the wrong end of the stick and thought that we were operating a stealthy aircraft ourselves! We don't have a copy on file here.

The applicant (who I would categorise as a reputable researcher) anticipates the possibility that any documents would be withheld under Section 27 (International Relations) but suggests that after 13 years this defence would not be viable. I would anticipate that withholding any documentation would result in an appeal.

I am looking for a response from you before Christmas.

Can I suggest that it might be an idea if you give me a call on Section 40 to discuss it in more detail?

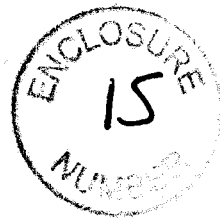

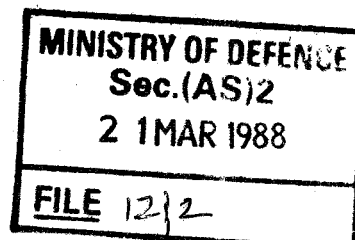

UFO SIGHTING

Sub Divisional Officer, Bradford Central

At 1930 hours on Thursday, 18 February 1988 I was off duty with my wife and 8 year old daughter. We were travelling in my vehicle along Toller Lane, Bradford towards Bingley.

When approximately at the junction with Leylands Lane, my daughter remarked that she could see a star that was moving. My wife looked at the object and said that it looked like a line of shining white lights and was going in the same direction as ourselves. I leant across the car and saw the object myself. It appeared to be fairly high in the sky. I could see a line of white lights travelling at the usual speed of an aeroplane.

My family requested that I stop to look more closely and I decided to stop in Thorne Lane off Bingley Road. This road overlooks the whole area and judging by the speed of the object I thought I would get there before it did.

However, as I passed the junction with Haworth Road, my wife who had watched the object continually, remarked that it suddenly turned left and accelerated quickly away.

When I stopped in Thorne Lane some seconds later the object was nowhere in sight.

During the period whilst it was in sight I glanced at it on three occasions. It was the size of a small passenger plane and it was difficult to judge its shape. The line of lights suggested it was long and thin.

I could hear no noise over the car noise. It was observed with the naked eye and no photographs were taken.

The weather was dry and windy, there were a few clouds in the sky that were moving quite fast with the wind. The object flew over a housing estate the only large buildings would be the Bradford Royal Infirmary and Sharpe's Printers.

On first seeing the object it could have been an aeroplane even though we could not see any coloured lights but when the object changed direction suddenly and accelerated we were sure it was not.

I have attached a map showing where my vehicle travelled during the sighting. The dotted line is the approximate route taken by the object.

During the evening of Wednesday 27th March, 1991, I was on motor patrol duty, in company with Bowstall [REDACTED] when we observed a bright object in the sky which gave us cause for concern. Bowstall from at Southend were contacted and informed of our sighting. We visited the bowstall tower at Southend Airport who confirmed having seen the object but were unable to determine what it was. The object later disappeared from view following a fairly lengthy period of observation. In accordance with S.O. Sec 36 PARAS 49, 51 & 81 I submit the following answers to the headings of the letters A-P inclusive as set out in PARA 81.

- A - 8.10 P.M. Wednesday 27th March, 1991. Duration of sighting 1 HR 30 MINS.
- B - A single bright white light, circular in shape size unknown. No sensation of noise or smell.
- C - Vanguard Way, Shoeburyness at its junction with Elm Road. Stationary in a police vehicle remaining in same throughout observation.
- D - Observed by both officers with the naked eye.
- E - Heading west of north from a gasometer located in Elm Road approximately 100 yards west of stationary patrol car.
- F - Approximately 450 from ground level.
- G - Approximately 6 miles west of gasometer.

Your Freedom of Information request of 17 December 2006 asked for the file opened by Nick Pope on the subject of crop circles and which US agency to contact regarding a visit by General Gabriel to Bentwaters in 1981.

In the course of handling previous requests for information about UFOs and similar phenomena, staff in DAS have made rigorous checks of the files created and held by this branch and its predecessors. All Government files have records showing when they were opened, closed and destroyed (if they are not kept for the permanent record). A check of our records has shown that no file has ever been opened on the subject of crop circles, either during Mr Popes' tenure, or at any other time. We are, however, unable to comment on the accuracy of anything that Mr Pope may have said to you.

If you wish to contact the US authorities regarding the actions of any of their personnel, I would suggest that you contact the US Department of Defence.

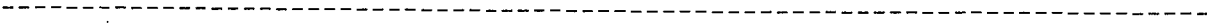

Acknowledgement of Request for an FOI Internal Review

The Director of Information Exploitation has asked me to acknowledge your e-mail of 19 December 2006 in which you asked for an internal review of your request for information (ref: 18-12-2006-065847-002) on 17 November 2006.

In your initial request you asked for a copy of a file that was opened by Nick Pope on crop circles between the years of 1991-1994 and any information of military involvement with crop circles in the last 10 years. The MOD responded to this request on 22 November 2006 and advised you that no files held by MOD specifically related to crop circles. It was explained in the response that any information on crop circles is filed on the UFO files. You were informed that the cost of a search of the files for this information would exceed the appropriate cost limit, currently set at £600.00 and MOD was therefore not obliged to comply with your request as provided for by s.12 of the FOI Act. The response went on to suggest that you refine your request to a period of one year.

I note that you sent three e-mails to MOD on 19 December 2006. The second of those e-mails contained a refined request for information held by MOD on crop circles in 1991. This request is being handled by the relevant branch and you will receive a response in due course.

The internal review will look at the handling of your request and the substance of the first aspect of your request, that is, for a file opened on crop circles by Nick Pope. On receiving a substantive reply to your refined request, you are of course able to request an internal review of the substance should you wish to do so, by writing to the Director of Information Exploitation, 6th Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB.

If you remain unhappy following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. 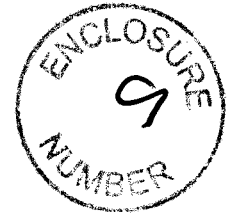

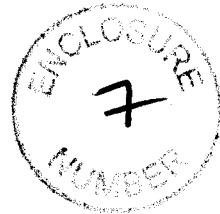

From time to time the MoD receives film or photographs purporting to be of UFOs. These are examined to see if they are of military interest and then placed on our files or returned to the originator.

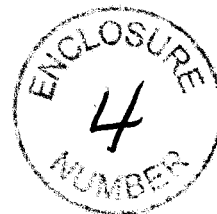

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 12 November 2006 asking whether the Ministry of Defence holds any information on crop circles and the nature of that information.

There is no evidence to suggest that crop circles are caused by anything of military concern and the MOD does not therefore investigate reported sightings or carry out any research into them. Members of the public do sometimes associate crop circles with UFOs and write to DAS about them. No separate record is kept of these and they are filed in the order in which they are received with our normal UFO reports and correspondence.

As to the matter of what type of information would be contained in our records, this could only be discovered by checking back through our files. Our files go back some 25 years and the costs involved would exceed the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

Further to my e-mail of 14 November 2006, I passed your request for information relating to the visit of General Gabriel to RAF Bentwater/Woodbridge in 1980 to the branch that is the focal point for dealing with US Forces in the UK.

They have conducted a search of file lists but have been unable to locate any files dealing specifically with the Generals visit in 1980 or, a more generic visits file, covering the period you are interested in, which is, a quarter of a century ago. It is possible that any briefing to the Commanding Officer, if it was ever written, is on file somewhere in the Ministry of Defence archives, but the task of identifying a single document amongst the entire MoD archive would be utterly impractical.

Whilst it is not possible to confidently identify standard working practices prevalent at the time, I am informed that unless the officer involved were to be meeting with members of the UK forces, government or civil service, the MoD would not expect to receive a briefing regarding a visit by a senior US officer to a US base in the UK.

In your e-mail of 9 November 2006, you asked for a review of the MoD response to your Freedom of Information request reference number 17-10-2006-155737-002. The branch responsible for reviewing our response has looked into your case and asked me to respond.

Your original request asked whether the Ministry of Defence website held any information on a General Gabrielle who visited RAF Woodbridge/Bentwaters following the Rendlesham Forest incident in 1980. I confirmed that it did and directed you to the relevant link which contains the MoD records relating to the incident. In so doing it is believed that your request was answered and therefore we can see no further need for review.

However, now that you have clarified the matter, it is clear from your e-mail of 9 November 2006 that this response does not meet your intended requirements. I shall therefore register your e-mail as a new Freedom of Information request and pass it to the relevant section to deal with. They will respond to you in due course.

The question of whether the Commanding Officer of Bentwaters/Woodbridge was informed of the visit of General Gabriel may be best dealt with by the US authorities, who would, of course, be responsible for informing their own personnel about the impending visit of one of their own senior officers. Might I suggest that in addition to requesting information from the Ministry of Defence, you also contact the US authorities.
